



Bronze Award Proposal Form

The Girl Scout Bronze Award is the highest honor a Girl Scout Junior can achieve. As you and your team plan and complete your project, you'll develop more confidence, meet new people, and have the kind of fun that happens when you work with other Girl Scouts to make a difference.

Please read the following requirements prior to submitting a proposal. Failure to meet these requirements may result in the proposal being returned without being reviewed by the Highest Awards Committee. Please keep this page for your reference.

Bronze Award Proposal Requirements:

- Every girl must be a registered Girl Scout Junior in 4th or 5th grade.
- Girls can work as individuals or groups to complete their project.
- Every girl must complete 1 journey at the Junior level before beginning their Bronze Award project, including the Take Action project.
- Every girl must attend an in-person Bronze Award training.
- The Girl Scout Bronze Award requires 20 hours per girl toward the project.
- The proposal form **must be completed by each girl working on the project**. Proposals should be written by the girl in her own words. Please type responses or write in pen.
- This form must be submitted to the Highest Awards Committee prior to the start of the project. Proposals need to be reviewed and approved by the committee before girls can begin putting their plan into action. **Girls should not begin their project until they receive approval.**
- Proposals must be submitted by **5pm on the 1st of the month** in order to be reviewed during that month's Highest Awards Committee meeting. Late projects will be reviewed in the following month.
- All Juniors have until September 1st of their 6th grade school year to earn their Bronze Award. Projects submitted after September 1st cannot be accepted.
- Projects can be submitted the following ways:

 - In person to the GSSNV front desk Monday through Friday 9am-5pm. Please do not submit projects during programs and events after business hours.
