Deposits and Fees

A non-refundable \$50 deposit per session is due with each registration. The deposit will serve as the first payment of the total camp fee. Deposits must be made through the registration system. All remaining fees must be paid within two weeks of your session start date. Registration closes three weeks prior to the chosen session start date.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada reserves the right to cancel or change any scheduled activities due to lack of enrollment, severe weather, or natural disaster.

For Camp cancellations, a three-week notice is required from the registration close date to receive a full refund minus the nonrefundable deposit. No transfers are permitted to be made from one Girl Scout's account to another.

Refunds may be issued with a minimum of 30 days notice in writing or email from the events registration close date. Refunds will not be issued for no-shows and/or partial week attendance.

All cancellation requests must be made in writing to: customerservice@girlscoutsnv.org. Requests should include member's name, address, program name, date, and reason for refund/cancellation.

Are you a returning camper who wants to be more involved? During your two weeks. work as a team to design and lead day camp events for younger campers. Explore several activities, including camp crafts, games, songs, outdoor education and more. Learn about team building, personal growth, and leadership basics. Completion of one LIA Award is required before continuing to Program Aid Award. Girl Scouts who have not completed the LIA Award requirement prior to the start of this camp session will be able to earn the LIA Award and Program Aid Award simultaneously. Program Aide participants will need to be available both weeks and participate in overnight activities each week in order to earn their PA Pin.

Ducktail Day Camp | Two week session | July 21 - August 1

Ready to take the next step in becoming a counselor?

Week 1 - Learn the basics of developing and delivering camp programs while gaining a behind-the-scenes look at the basics of camp operations. Week 2 - you will be fully immersed in an internship where you can use your skills as a "counselor" for younger campers. We conclude each week with a required overnight stay. CITs must demonstrate maturity, commitment, leadership potential, and be able to work well with others to create a positive environment. CITs will also enjoy traditional camp activities during their stay. Upon successful completion of this program, CIT1 Campers will earn the CIT1 Pin. Participation in this program includes an application process.



CIT 2 (Grades 9-12 in 2025-2026)

Frias Frontier Overnight Camp | Two week session | June 9 - June 20

Located at Frias Frontier Overnight Camp, this is the second level of CIT training, and it focuses on skills needed to work with youth at camp. Learn behaviors to expect from campers and how to manage them, and how to work as a team with all staff. In addition to building your skills working with campers, you will learn more about the operations of camp. Spend time observing and assisting in different areas of camp. Participation in this program is dependent on successful completion of CIT 1 and application.
