



About Our Summer Camps

Frias Frontier

Through a generous donation from the Charles and Phyllis M. Frias Charitable Trust, the Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada received a gift of land in Lincoln County, Nevada. This gracious contribution enabled Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada to establish the Frias Frontier Girl Scout Camp, situated 90 miles north of Las Vegas. At Frias Frontier, visitors may encounter our donkey, horses from our herd, miniature ponies, chickens, and wildlife such as lizards and owls. Campers may find themselves staying in the lodge, cabins, covered wagons or tents during their stay.

Ducktail Day Camp

Camp Ducktail is hosted at our council headquarters in Las Vegas, NV. During camp girls may participate in outdoor activities in the grassy back courtyard (weather permitting) as well as fun activities inside our air-conditioned building. Every day is a new adventure, guaranteeing fun for our newest and returning campers alike! Older Girl Scouts may learn new skills through the Program Aid and CIT 1 programs offered only at Camp Ducktail. All Girl Scouts will explore, try new things and build self-confidence while learning camp skills. Each week of camp includes an optional end of week overnight camp out at council headquarters.

Why Girl Scouts?

Girl Scouts helps girls discover the wonders of nature, experience the thrill of adventure, and challenge themselves to reach new heights.

Girls increase their interest, confidence, and competency in the outdoors with the backing of a global sisterhood that helps them expand their horizons while connecting with the world around them.

And Girl Scout camp is fun. Girls have a chance to make new friends and explore nature guided by our amazing camp staff who are there to support them along the way. Your Girl Scout may want to go to camp for the archery, horse experiences, hiking, or just doing arts and crafts. You can start her outdoor adventure slow and steady by attending our Ducktail Day Camp.

She will learn important leadership and independent skills that help foster her self-confidence while challenging her to try something new.


Shine

Frias Frontier Add-Ons

Saddle Up: Horseback Riding Experience



Saddle Up!

Grab the reins and saddle up ! With this add-on experience, your Girl Scout and her team will ride, feed, groom and maybe even muck a few stalls, but hey that's all part of having a horse for the week! Your Girl Scout will create unforgettable connections and a lifetime of memories with her new friends—two and four legged alike. Add-on experience may vary week to week.

Early Bird - \$200 / per camper, per session

Regular Pricing - \$225 / per camper, per session

A \$25.00 non-refundable deposit per session is due upon registration.

Trading Post

Girl Scouts with trading post funds will visit the trading post at least twice during their time at camp and items range from camp-specific merchandise to patches and camp attire.

Prices for items range from \$1 and up. Adding money to your trading post account is optional and can be done at registration or by calling GSSNV within 10 business days of the start date of camp.

We recommend about \$20/week. To provide a smoother and safer service, overnight camp will be cashless. Trading Post funds that are not spent during the week will be returned in the form of a GSSNV shop gift card within 30 days of camp end date.



Ducktail Day Camp

Back to Basics - Outdoor Explorers

Join us at Ducktail Day Camp as we go Back to Basics and become outdoor explorers. Your Girl Scout will learn something new, have adventures, and make new friends. Our weekly sessions are a great introduction to camping and the outdoors. Each week our Ducktail campers will explore their inner creativity, learn about hiking safety, and participate in age-appropriate themed activities, make new friends, learn a new skill and find a connection with nature. At the same time our first-time campers will begin building their confidence away from home. New this year, your Girl Scout will get to test their outdoor skills with an optional overnight campout at the end of the week. Perfect for those who are not yet ready for a week-long overnight camping trip. Ducktail Day Camp is located at Council Headquarters.

As an optional activity, show off your new skills as you camp under the night sky snacking on s'mores and telling stories with your new friends while gaining confidence in your newfound skills.

All Knotted Up

Figure 8? Square? Bowline? Do you know your knots? Spend a week where outdoor exploration meets creative exploration and your Girl Scout will learn basic knots and lashings used in camping and outdoor activities. She will be able to test her new found engineering skills and build a structure of her choosing to use during an optional overnight campout at the end of the week.

Week 3
7/22 - 7/26

Outdoor Chef Life

Calling all foodies! Become a top chef in the kitchen AND over the campfire. From cooking an egg to making a three-course meal, campers will perfect their culinary skills. Girl Scouts will try unique recipes and techniques, participate in demos, and put their skills to the test at the end of the week where they will serve up a meal for their Ducktail friends. Join in the fun at the optional overnight campout at the end of the week.

7/29 - 8/2

Create It

Calling all artistic creators: it's time to unleash and bring your creativity to the next level! Explore a variety of art mediums with DIY projects all week to take home - we'll explore nature art, hold craft workshops exploring different craft techniques from painting, 3D Printing, and designing and creating your very own Ducktail Day Camp Tshirt. We'll conclude the week with a gallery exhibition to showcase your masterpieces and relax the night away with an optional overnight sleepover sharing stories, singing songs while munching on s'mores.

Program Aide (Entering Grades 7-8 in 2024-2025) 7/8 - 7/12 and 7/15 - 7/19 Two week session

Are you a returning camper who wants to be more involved? During your two weeks, work as a team to design and lead day camp events for younger campers. Explore several activities, including camp crafts, games, songs, outdoor education and more. Learn about team building, personal growth, and leadership basics. Completion of one LIA Award is required before continuing to Program Aid Award. Girl Scouts who have not completed the LIA Award requirement prior to the start of this camp session will be able to earn the LIA Award and Program Aid Award simultaneously. Program Aide participants will need to be available both weeks and participate in overnight activities each week in order to earn their PA Pin.

CIT 1 (Entering Grades 10 - 12 in 2024-2025) 7/22 - 7/26 and 7/29 - 8/2 Two week session

Ready to take the next step in becoming a counselor? Week 1 - Learn the basics of developing and delivering camp programs while gaining a behind-the-scenes look at the basics of camp operations. Week 2 - you will be fully immersed in an internship where you can use your skills as a "counselor" for younger campers. We conclude each week with a required overnight stay. CITs must demonstrate maturity, commitment, leadership potential, and be able to work well with others to create a positive environment. CITs will also enjoy traditional camp activities during their stay. Upon successful completion of this program, CIT1 Campers will earn the CIT1 Pin. Participation in this program includes an application process.

Financial Information

Deposits and Fees

A non-refundable deposit per session is due with each registration. The deposit will serve as the first payment of the total camp fee. Deposits must be made through the registration system. All remaining fees must be paid within two weeks of your session start date. Registration closes three weeks prior to the chosen session start date.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada reserves the right to cancel or change any scheduled activities due to lack of enrollment, severe weather, or natural disaster. Cancellation and refund requests must be made in writing, or email ten business (10) days before the event to receive a 100% refund. If applicable, *The \$25 Girl Scout membership fee and \$15 GSSNV Council Service fee are non-refundable. The \$50.00 deposit will not be refunded. No transfers are permitted to be made from one Girl Scout's account to another.

Refunds will not be issued for no-shows and partial week attendance.

All refund requests must be made in writing to: customerservice@girlscoutsnv.org -Requests should include member's name, address, program name, date, and reason for refund/cancellation.

Not a member? Not a problem!

A \$40 GSSNV membership fee is all it takes. Fee does not apply to currently registered Girl Scouts.

Camperships

What is a campership?

Camperships are financial assistance funded by the generosity of donors who contribute to our campership fund each year. Our goal is to make camp a possibility for all girls.

How do I apply for camperships?

You must register for camp and pay the \$50 deposit, then complete the Campership Request form online or scan the QR Code.



When is the deadline to apply?

Campership applications open March 18, 2024 and all applications are due two weeks before the requested camp session. For more info, email: customerservice@girlscoutsnv.org

How do I know we will receive a campership?

All applicants will receive notification within 5 business days of submitted application.
